





MARRIAGE LICENCES



Before getting married in Ontario, you must obtain a marriage licence. Marriage licences are issued by the Town and are valid for marriage ceremonies occurring anywhere in Ontario for three months from the date of issue. Please note a civil marriage ceremony is **NOT** available through the municipal clerk at the Town of Petawawa.

A Commissioner of Oaths is available at the municipal office to take your oath or solemn affirmation when signing affidavits or statutory declarations. If your affidavit requires both a witness and a Commissioner signature, you must provide your own witness. The Commissioner cannot prepare affidavits or provide you with any advice with respect to the documents you are swearing.

You need to read and fully understand the documents yourself. The Commissioner reserves the right to refuse to commission documents.

PLEASE HELP US KEEP OUR STREETS AND SIDEWALKS SAFE & ACCESSIBLE THIS WINTER

When placing your garbage, recycling, or green bins for collection, please avoid putting them on snowbanks, sidewalks, or multi-use pathways (MUPs). These can become obstacles for our snowplow and sidewalk machine operators, as well as for pedestrians, families with strollers, and people with mobility challenges.

Instead, place your containers at least 5 feet back from the curb or pavement edge, in your driveway. This ensures safe snow removal and helps prevent damage to your bins.

Please note that the Town of Petawawa is not responsible for any damage to containers placed incorrectly. Thank you for your cooperation!

SNOW SAFETY TIPS

While snowstorms can be a major inconvenience for adults, kids see it as a great time to climb, build, and slide on mountains of white stuff! The Town of Petawawa Public Works Department wishes to remind parents of the potential hazards of snow play for their children:

- Children should never play in or on snow banks that border roads, since snow plow operators and other drivers may not see them.
- According to <u>childsafetylink.ca/snow-safety</u> –
 At least one Canadian child suffocates each
 year after being trapped in a snow structure.
- Kids should only build snow forts without roofs, since snow roofs can collapse.
- Active supervision is important. School-aged children should play outside with a friend who could call for help if a situation arose.
- Children should keep well away from snowblowers (both the machine itself and the snow plume that is ejected from it).

Let's all play safe this winter.


Eligible users of this subsidized transportation service include those with a disability, low income, seniors or vulnerable sector individuals.

SAFELY DISPOSE OF WOOD ASHES: PREVENT FIRES, PROTECT PROPERTY

Even though the ashes you have cleaned out of your wood stove may look like they have cooled off, there is a good chance there may still be some burning embers. Hot ashes will melt green bins, set garbage collection trucks on fire and even cause significant property damage.

To ensure the safe disposal of wood ashes, store them outside in a metal container away from any other combustible materials until cooled. On your regular garbage collection day, place cooled ashes into a combustible container (i.e. box or bag) and place out with regular garbage.

TIP: Use extra caution when transferring cooled ashes to a combustible container; introducing oxygen can reignite embers that may appear to be cooled.



Monoxide (CO) injuries and deaths in Ontario continue to occur in homes.

Most, if not all of these incidents, are preventable.

Be in the know when it comes to CO: get your fuelburning appliances inspected and have working CO alarms in your home.

Smoke alarms reduce the risk of dying in a home by fire by more than half; roughly three out of five fire deaths happen in homes with either no smoke alarms or no working smoke alarms.

Smoke alarms serve as the first line of defense in a home fire, but they need to be working in order to protect people. The Town of Petawawa Fire Department encourages all residents to actively support the 2024 Fire Prevention Week theme, "Smoke alarms: Make them work for you!"

Working smoke alarms can make a life-saving difference in a home fire, giving people the time to get out safely. This year's FPW campaign is a great way to remind everyone about these messages and to act on them.

The Town of Petawawa Fire Department offers these key smoke alarm safety tips and guidelines:

- Install smoke alarms in every bedroom, outside each separate sleeping area (like a hallway), and on each level (including the basement) of the home.
- Make sure smoke alarms meet the needs of all family members, including those with sensory or physical disabilities.
- Test smoke alarms at least once a month by pushing the test button.
- Replace all smoke alarms when they are 10 years old.



We are pleased to announce that effective August 22, the Town's new Official Plan has been approved and is in effect. The document sets out the goals and objectives that direct growth and development including residential, commercial, and industrial uses and sets out timelines for that development. The Official Plan also identifies the location of major infrastructure and public facilities in the municipality. The Plan and corresponding schedules are available for review on the Town's website.

With the new Official Plan in place and with the recent direction provided from the Province via the new Provincial Planning Statement 2024 (PPS 2024) we are now working towards updating several of our By-Laws such that they better align with both of these policy documents. Watch for notices and information over the coming months pertaining to these updates.

One important change that residents will see with an updated Official Plan will be the possibility of creating 3 dwelling units on a fully serviced lot within Petawawa. The province has expanded infill opportunities and greater densification to occur within our existing subdivisions. This is a direct result of the issues surrounding housing affordability and attainability.


