## 2. Skateboard Park Pilot Project Presentation

Colin Coyle, Recreation Program Coordinator, provided an overview of a pilot project to construct a skate park at the Civic Centre. The project would be in partnership with the Action Sports Development Program at Algonquin College Pembroke Campus. Students from the program will build and install ramps, develop a maintenance manual and schedule and provide an education day on skateboarding to the community. Mr. Coyle noted this project is in support of the 2012 recommendation to the Recreation Master Plan to build a skate park. Estimated municipal cost to construct the park is \$3,000.00, which includes features and signage. Construction of a permanent facility will be considered at the culmination of the pilot project phase.

### 3. CS-01-20 – Canada Day 2020 Celebration Event

Mr. Williams reported on the benefits of relocating the 2020 Canada Day Celebrations from Centennial Park to the Civic Centre. Evaluation of post-event discussions from 2019 indicated many benefits to retaining celebrations at the Civic Centre again this year. The Civic Centre provided ample parking, ease of movement for operational vehicles and emergency services, use of the Kinhut for bar operations and the mobile stage was positioned to provide a central location for music and Canada Day revelries. Mr. Williams also highlighted operational efficiencies as the event set-up/tear-down and site clean-up required far less time and staff resources to complete.
