1. Zoning By-law Amendment (from Rural to Rural - Exception Eighteen (RU-E18), Part of Lot 9, Concession Lake Range, Sack Road

The Public Meeting was opened by the Mayor at 6:34 p.m. Karen Cronier, Director of Planning and Development, introduced the zoning by-law amendment application submitted by Mr. Emerson Sack for rezoning lands that are located within Lot 9 Lake Range. Ms. Cronier advised that the Notice of the Public Meeting had been provided as required under the *Planning Act*.

Mayor Serviss asked if any written comments have been received regarding the application. Ms. Cronier confirmed that no comments have been received.

Ms. Cronier briefly explained the purpose of the amendment is to rezone the retained lands in Consent Application B55/22 from Rural to Rural-Exception Eighteen. The lot addition consists of 26.65 ha of vacant land added to a 0.56 ha lot with an existing dwelling that fronts on Gutzman Road. The retained lands have a frontage of 20 m on Sack Road and therefore requires an amendment to the zoning by-law to permit a reduced frontage from 30 m to 20 m within a Rural zone.

Mayor Serviss asked to hear comments from the applicant and then the public. The applicant was not present, and no comments were received from the public.

Mayor Serviss asked to hear comments from members of Council. Ms. Cronier explained the appeal process.

Mayor Serviss declared the Public Meeting closed at 6:36 p.m.
