Presentations

County of Renfrew – Doran and Petawawa Blvd Roundabout – Taylor Hanrath,
 Manager of Capital Works

Mayor Serviss welcomed Taylor Hanrath, County of Renfrew Capital Works Manager, Craig Kelley, CAO, County of Renfrew, and Glenn Doncaster, Chair, Operations Committee, County of Renfrew.

Mr. Kelley thanked the Town Council for providing them the opportunity to address the proposed Petawawa Boulevard Roundabout project.

Mr. Hanrath opened the presentation and thanked Council for the opportunity to address Town Council on the County of Renfrew's plan to apply for grant funding for the roundabout at Doran Road, Hilda Street, Petawawa Boulevard and Mohns Avenue. Mr. Hanrath commented on the proposed future design for the Petawawa Boulevard Roundabout, and he provided a total estimated project cost of approximately \$4.3 million. Mr. Hanrath also commented on how much this proposed plan would improve traffic flow along the Boulevard and greatly enhance safety for motorists. Mr. Hanrath informed Council that breaking down the project into manageable pieces and applying for funding at each stage over time could help make this project feasible if their grant application were to be approved.

Council discussed the proposed roundabout and commented on the benefits of this project.

Mr. Hanrath is seeking Council approval to support the County of Renfrew in submitting a grant application request for the Petawawa Boulevard Roundabout at Doran Road, Mohns Avenue and Hilda Street.
