# 1. Monthly Report – October 2024

Mr. Mantha reported on the status of the Public Works Office expansion, which is on track for completion in early 2025, the completion of the Comfort Station project, and the Wolfe Avenue, Portage Road, and Murphy Road construction projects. Mr. Mantha also reported on the status of the department's infrastructure priorities such as the Town's fleet procurement, the installation of the new charging station for the Town's electric vehicle, and that roads and transportation projects, water and sewer, and civic property projects are all currently being designed and costed for the upcoming 2025 budget planning workshop.

# 2. <u>PW-30-2024 – Options for Speed Reduction on County Road #51 Petawawa</u> Boulevard between Golf Course Road and Silke Drive in the Town of Petawawa

Chris Mantha provided an overview of the report.

Council discussed the proposed options within the report as well as leaving County Road #51 at the same speed limit with the implementation of a Community Safety Zone.

That Council requests the County of Renfrew implement a community safety zone at Pine View Public School which will include community safety zone signage, flashing lights to alert drivers of the school zone, along with "school zone" painted on the road, with no reduction of the current speed limit on County Road #51 (Petawawa Boulevard).

include community safety zone signage, flashing lights to alert drivers of the school zone, along with "school zone" painted on the road.
