Ongoing Business

1. Business General

E-News posts were circulated to registered businesses on August 14th & 22nd and September 5, 2024. The links were posted to the PBAN social media pages and are available here: [Business E-News - The Town of Petawawa](#).

The following programs, grants, and resources are available to businesses and affiliate organizations.

- I. **Green and Inclusive Community Buildings (GICB)** – Eligible applicants with small and medium-sized projects to retrofit existing community buildings ranging in total eligible cost from \$100,000 to \$2,999,999 can apply until October 16, 2024. Eligible applicants with large projects to retrofit existing community buildings or projects to build new community buildings with total eligible costs ranging from \$3 million to \$25 million can apply from September 4, 2024, until October 16, 2024. Information webinars are scheduled for August 7, August 28 and September 18. To register for a webinar, email your request to gicbwebinar-webinairebcvi@info.gc.ca.
- II. **Francophone Wage Subsidy Program:** 50% funding for francophone employees. This program is administered through [Renfrew County Community Futures Development Corporation](#). Funding is not available for businesses that have previously received funding.
- III. **Skills Development Fund Training** – The [Skills Development Fund \(SDF\) Training Stream](#) offers funding to organizations for innovative projects that address challenges to hiring, training, or retaining workers, including apprentices, to drive Ontario's economic growth. The deadline to apply is October 4th, 2024.
- IV. **Community Improvement Plan (CIP):** Applicants interested in learning more about this local matching fund program, which provides for building improvement works, should review the material provided on the municipal website at [Community Improvement Plan \(CIP\)](#) - The Town of Petawawa.

Returning Business

1. Comfort Station & Site Development

A roundtable discussion occurred about the elements proposed as part of the Comfort Station Norman area development. Council previously endorsed this site as a viable community hub and now with the Comfort Station opening, staff worked with Thinc Design, as an addendum, to the Parks and Recreation Master Plan, to create a site plan for some proposed additional elements. A Petawawa Letter Sign and Container Market have been included in this concept. Staff will bring this forward to Council at an upcoming meeting.

2. Taste of the Valley

The Town of Petawawa partnered with the County of Renfrew to host a Taste of the Valley event in Petawawa on September 28th, 2024. The event will be open to the public 10:00 am to 3:00 pm. There are currently 107 outdoor booths reserved for approximately 90 exhibitors. Volunteers are needed to help with traffic control starting at 7:00am. The event will feature live music from Adam Fieldhouse and Randa Teschner. An application has been submitted to host Taste of the Valley again in 2026.

New Business

1. County of Renfrew Grant Support Request for Roundabout at Doran Rd.

Councillor Driscoll discussed the proposed roundabout at the intersection of Doran Road, Petawawa Boulevard and Mohns Avenue. He reported that the County of Renfrew will be submitting a funding application for up to 50% of the project costs. PBAN members voiced concerns regarding traffic backing up into the roundabout from the intersection at Petawawa Boulevard and Victoria Street. This was received as information only as the project is not slated to proceed without the funding support.

Due to a scheduling conflict with the Pembroke Santa Claus parade, the date for the Petawawa parade and the Holiday Outdoor Tailgate Market has been changed to December 7th, 2024. Presentations

The Town of Petawawa and North Grenville participated in the First Impressions Community Exchange (FICE) program in June and July 2024. Presentations between the two municipalities took place. The full presentation of this exercise will be made to members of Council at an upcoming Council-in-Committee meeting.

Round Table

Bill indicated a strong tourism business over the summer. The Shed will close following the Petawawa Ramble.

Gerald reported that work on the development of Portage Landing and along Wilson Avenue was proceeding.

Councillor Driscoll commented that he appreciated the FICE presentation and remarked that it provided good insight into how our community is perceived from a visitor's perspective.

Val reminded everyone that the Upper Ottawa Valley Chamber of Commerce Business Awards is September 28th and former Mayor Bob Sweet would be receiving the Life Time Achievement Award.

Christina reported that they have seen an increase in the uptake of family support services since the beginning of September. Summer had been slow for program participation.

Jillian reported a change in staff due to postings that were also challenging the customer base for their business. They reported that the annual End of the Leash Block party was well attended but that the sales transactions per customer were down.

Cindy provided a real estate update for August noting 16 sales in Petawawa with an average selling price of \$479,500, up 3.7% from August of 2023. The year-to-date residential home sale price in Petawawa is \$511,385.

Richard shared the many events that Dog House Brewing Company has participated in and would be attending in the autumn. Plans are still in the works to move and open at the new location by the end of the year.

Jamie reported that he would be attending the Outdoor Sportsman Show to represent the hotel in collaboration with the Town of Petawawa. At a Choice Canada conference in November, Jamie noted that he was asked to be on a speaker panel to discuss how he created an award-winning hotel. The CNL industry day was well attended and provided an opportunity to hear about upcoming contracts and engage directly with the firms that do work on the campus.
